



Aggressive Hiring Competition Over an Average Supply of Regional Talent




Supply (Jobs)

Demand (Job Postings)


Competition from online job postings is high in Yankton County, SD. The national average for an area this size is 41* job postings/mo, while there are 97 here.

Supply (Jobs)


Supply Is About Equal to the National Average



Retirement Risk Is About Average, While Overall Diversity Is Low




Retiring Soon

Racial diversity is low in Yankton County, SD. The national average for an area this size is 933* racially diverse employees, while there are 150 here.




Gender Diversity


Unemployment Rate Trends

Unemployment shown at the 2-digit sector level.



Industry Race/Ethnicity Breakdown






